


## The Urkund Plagiarism Detection Tool

Urkund is the originality and citation checking tool available in Brightspace. Urkund will compare the text in your student assignments, with text in the Urkund archive. The Urkund archive includes all UCD submissions, as well as student submissions from other participating universities, content available publicly on the web and content published in a wide range of academic journals. It will then return a matching score on each assignment and produce a report that shows the original sources in its archive that have matched directly with the text in each assignment submission. It is up to the lecturer to review the report and determine if plagiarism has occurred in the student submission.


**Step 1** - To access the Urkund originality checker, go to *Assessment* and select *Originality Checker*.



**Step 2** - The list of assignments in your module will appear. To review submissions via Urkund click *Turn On / Off Plagiarism Detection* on the assignment.




**Step 3** - The process may take some time. Return to the *Originality Checker* at a later stage to review.






**Step 4** - To review the assignment, click the assignment name to see submissions.



**Step 5** - The matching score will be visible. Click *Show Details*.



**Step 6** - To view the Urkund report, click on the assignment name and select *View Report*.




**Step 7** - The Urkund report will open in a new browser window. Click *MATCHING TEXT* to view the report in detail.





**Step 8** - The report displays a direct comparison between text in the submitted assignment and text in the Urkund Archive.



**Step 9** - By default, the Urkund report is not available to students. Click *Display Similarity Report to Students upon submission* to enable student access. Instructors may choose to enable this for students so they can check their written material against sources on the Urkund archive before submitting the assignment formally. The aim is to help students improve their academic writing techniques by highlighting similarities to other sources. Students will see the same matching score and Urkund report available to the Instructor.
